GEOGRAPHIC APPLICATIONS OF THE SHORELINE MANAGEMENT ACT AS IT APPLIES TO STEVENS COUNTY

The Shoreline Management Act covers all "shorelines of the state" which includes shorelines and "shorelines of state-wide significance" within the State. (See RCW 90.58.030)

In general, these include:

Certain waters of the state, together with the lands underlying them;

Streams and rivers with a mean annual flow of 20 cubic feet per second (cfs) or more;

Lakes and reservoirs larger than 20 acres in area; and

Biological wetlands associated with the above.

Those lands extending landward for two-hundred (200) feet as measured on a horizontal plane from the ordinary high water mark (OHWM) or floodway, whichever is greater, of "shorelines of the state" are considered jurisdictional lands under this program.

The following lakes, rivers and streams and their associated wetlands are within the jurisdiction of the Stevens County Shoreline Management Master Program: (WACs 173-18-046 and 173-20-046 shall apply in the event of any omissions from this master program.)

STEVENS COUNTY LAKE ENVIRONMENT DESIGNATIONS

Little Falls Reservoir T27N-R39E, Parallel designation, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural.

Newbill Lake T30N-R37E, Rural designation.

Deer Lake T30N-R41E, Suburban designation, except for Tax #77 (owned by the Deer Lake Property Owners Association) and Deer Lake wetlands which are designated Conservancy.

Loon Lake T30N-R41E, Suburban designation, except for Tax #51 (State land) and the shoreline area north of Tax #51 to Government Lots #3 & #4 (the west boundary of the McVay Addition) and all Loon Lake wetlands, which have a Conservancy designation, AND those portions of Government Lots #6&7 within the Granite Point Plat, which are designated Urban.

Grays Lake T31N-R40E, Conservancy designation.

Waitts Lake T31N-R40E, Parallel designation from the west boundary of Taylor road and Lot #4 of Beaver Park westward around lake to the west line of tax #50 on the north side of the lake where the designation changes to Rural and continues around the east and south sides to Taylor road and Lot #4.

Jump-Off-Joe-Lake T31N-R40E, Rural designation, except from the south boundary of Tax #2 (public access area) to the west boundary of Tax #8 which is designated parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural.

Beitey Lake T31N-R41E, Conservancy designation.

Nelson Lake T31N-R41E, Conservancy designation.

Clark Lake T32N-R37E, Rural designation.

Rainbow Lake T32N-R39E, Conservancy designation.

Browns Lake T32N-R39E, Parallel designation, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural.

Horseshoe Lake T32N-R41E, Conservancy designation.

Bayley Lake T34N-R41E, Conservancy designation.

Pond No. 1 T34N-R41E, Conservancy designation.(Associated with Bayley Lake)

Rocky Lake T35N-R39E, Conservancy designation.

Keogh Lake T35N-R40E, Rural designation.

White Mud Lake T35N-R40E, Rural designation.

Hatch Lake T35N-R40E, Rural designation.

Starvation Lake T35N-R40E, Rural designation, except for public owned lands, which has a Conservancy designation.

Black Lake T35N-R41E, Rural designation, except for public owned lands, which has a Conservancy designation.

Spruce (Twin) Lakes T35N-R41E, Conservancy designation.

Mission Lake T36N-R38E, Rural designation.

Heritage Lake T36N-R42E, Rural designation, except for public owned lands, which have a Conservancy designation.

Thomas Lake T36N-R42E, Rural designation, except for public owned lands, which have a Conservancy designation.

Gillette Lake T36N-R42E, Rural designation, except for public owned lands which have a Conservancy designation.

Sherry Lake T36N-R42E, Rural designation, except for public owned lands which have a Conservancy designation.

Coffin Lake T36N-R42E, Conservancy designation.

Peterson Swamp T37N-R39E, Rural designation.

Echo Lake T37N-R39E, Rural designation.

Dilly Lake T38N-R37E, Rural designation.

Perkins Lake T38N-R37E, Rural designation.

Ryan Lake T38N-R37E, Rural designation.

Williams Lake T38N-R38E, Parallel designation, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, except for public owned lands which have a Conservancy designation.

Phelan Lake T38N-R39E, Conservancy designation.

Pierre Lake T39N-R37E, Parallel designation, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural.

Pepoon Lake T39N-R39E, Rural designation.

Deep Lake T39N-R41E, Rural designation, except for the steep sloped area on the west shoreline where the designation is parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural.

Cedar Lake T40N-R41E, Conservancy designation.

Little Joe Lake T40N-R42E, Rural designation.

STEVENS COUNTY RIVER AND STREAM ENVIRONMENT DESIGNATIONS

Big Sheep Creek - Sec.2, T40N, R38E downstream to mouth at the Columbia River near Sand Point (Sec.30, T40N, R40E). The 200 cfs MAF point begins at mouth of Little Sheep Creek (Sec. 14, T40N, R39E). The environment designation is Rural, except for public owned lands which have a Conservancy designation.

Chamokane Creek - From the confluence of Chamokane Creek and unnamed stream (Sec.23, T29N, R40E) downstream left shore only (right shore within the Spokane Nation) to mouth on Spokane River (Sec.15, T27N, R39E). The environment designation is Rural downstream to the bridge at Ford where the road that goes to Wellpinit crosses and then the designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, downstream to where the creek enters the Spokane River.

Chewelah Creek - From the confluence of the North Fork and the South Fork Chewelah Creek (Sec.11, T32N, R40E) downstream to mouth on Colville River (Sec. 23, same township). The environment designation is Rural.

Colville River - From the confluence of Deer Creek and Sheep Creek (Sec.9, T30N, R40E) downstream to mouth at Columbia River (Sec.36, T36N, R37E). This river has over 300 sq. miles of drainage area ending at mouth of Chewelah Creek (Sec.23, T32N, R40E). The environment designation is Rural from the confluence of Deer Creek and Sheep Creek to the Arden bridge (Sec.10, T34N, R39E) where the Environment Designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, downstream to the Orin-Rice bridge. At this point, the designation is Rural downstream to the Greenwood Loop road bridge where the designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, and continues downstream to where the Colville River enters Lake Roosevelt.

Columbia River - From the United States-Canadian boundary (Sec.2, T40N, R41E) downstream to the Spokane Indian Reservation boundary (Sec.23, T29N, R35E). This river has over 200 cfs MAF at U.S.-Canadian border. The environment designation is Rural from the Canadian border downstream to where the Kettle River enters the Columbia. This designation applies to the north shoreline area only (Flat Creek side). For the south shoreline area, the environment designation is Rural from the Canadian border downstream to where Onion Creek enters the Columbia (Sec. 23, T39N, R39E) at this point the designation changes to Parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, and runs downstream to a point north of Bossburg known as Boss Hog Gully and at this point the designation changes to Rural and runs downstream to the south city limit of Marcus (Sec.31, T37N, R38E). The designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, and runs downstream to where US 395 crosses the Columbia near Kettle Falls. The designation changes to Rural at this point and runs downstream south of the Gifford Ferry access point (unnamed creek Sec.15, T32N, R37E). The designation changes to Parallel 50, foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, and runs downstream to the Spokane Nation boundary (Sec.23, T29N, R35E) where the designation changes to Conservancy and runs to the confluence of the Spokane and Columbia Rivers and leaves Stevens County.

Deep Creek (South Fork) - From the confluence of Rocky Creek and South Fork of Deep Creek in (Sec.8, T37N, R41E) downstream to confluence North Fork Deep Creek and Deep Creek in (Sec. 5, T38N, R41E). The environment designation is Rural.

Deep Creek (North Fork) - From the confluence of McKinnon Creek and North Fork Deep Creek in Sec.11, T39N, R41E) downstream through Deep Lake to confluence with South Fork Deep Creek and Deep Creek in (Sec. 5, T38N, R41E.). The environment designation is Rural.

Deep Creek - From the confluence of the South Fork and North Fork of Deep Creek in (Sec. 5, T38N, R41E) downstream to mouth at Columbia River (Sec.34, T40N, R40E). The environment designation is Rural.

Kettle River - From the United States-Canadian border (Sec.2, T40N, R36E) downstream along Ferry-Stevens County line to where the Kettle River enters the Columbia River (left bank only). This stream has both 200 cfs MAF and 300 sq. miles of drainage area at U.S.-Canadian border. The environment designation is Rural from the Canadian border to Liberty Canyon (Sec.25, T39N, R36E) and at this point the designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural downstream to where the river enters the Columbia River (Sec. 21, T37N, R37E).

Little Pend Oreille River - From the Pend Oreille County border (Sec. 4, T36N, R6E) to the Colville River (Sec.10, T34N, R39E). The environment designation is Rural from the Pend Oreille County border downstream to the Little Pend Oreille Natural Area Preserve (Sec. 30, T36N, R42E) and at this point the designation changes to Natural and runs downstream to the end of the preserve area. At this point, the designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, and runs downstream to Gap Creek (Sec.14, T35N, R41E). At Gap Creek the designation changes to Rural and runs downstream to Cedar Creek (Sec.21, T35N, R41E) where at this point the designation changes to Conservancy and runs downstream through the Little Pend Oreille Wildlife Refuge. The designation changes to Rural at the border of the Refuge (Sec.5, T34N, R40E) and runs downstream to where the river enters the Colville River (Sec.10, T34N, R39N).

Little Sheep Creek - From the confluence of Boundary Creek and Little Sheep Creek (Sec. 10, T40N, R39E) downstream to mouth at Big Sheep Creek (Sec.14, T40N, R39E). The environment designation is Conservancy.

Mill Creek - From Sec.15, T36N, R40E down stream to the Colville River (Sec.31, T36N, R39E). The environment designation is Rural.

Onion Creek - From the confluence of Onion Creek and unnamed creek (Sec.12, T38N, R39E) downstream to mouth at Columbia River (Sec.23, T39N, R39E). The environment designation is Rural.

Spokane River - From the Spokane County line on the Spokane River (Sec.32, T27N, R42E) downstream through Long Lake to the Spokane Indian Reservation boundary (Sec.15, T27N, R39E), right shore only. This river has 300 sq. miles of drainage area and over 200 cfs MAF at the Spokane County line. The environment designation is Rural from the Spokane County line downstream to Government Lot #5, a point east of Sandy Canyon and west of View Point

Subdivision. At this point, the designation changes to parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural, and this designation runs downstream to the south line of the NE of the NW quarter of Section 36, T27N, R41E where the designation changes to Suburban and runs downstream to the NW boundary of Tax #3, Section 22, T27N, R41E. At this point the designation changes to Parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural and runs downstream to Holmes Canyon (Sec.32, T28N, R41E) where the designation changes to Rural and runs downstream to Hendricks Canyon where the designation changes to Conservancy and runs downstream to the west line of Government Lot #1 in Section 15, T27N, R40E where the designation changes to Parallel, 50 foot Conservancy and 150 foot Rural. The Parallel designation runs downstream to the Spokane Nation boundary where the designation changes to Conservancy and runs downstream to where the river enters the Columbia River/Lake Roosevelt.
